

Researching Social and Environmental Changes from Cultural Perspective A workshop for Building Academic Capacity 12 - 14 October 2024

About the workshop

The workshop "Researching Social and Environmental Changes from Cultural Perspective", hosted by the Regional Center for Social Science and Sustainable Development (RCSD) of the Faculty of Social Sciences, Chiang Mai University and Integrative Center for Humanities Innovation, Faculty of Humanities, Chiang Mai University, is designed to foster a network of scholars from Southeast Asia and South Asia who are engaged in research on social and environmental changes from humanistic, social, and cultural perspectives. This workshop aims to facilitate collaboration, allowing participants to develop and present innovative ideas about the socio-environmental crisis to the academic community.

The workshop is a part of "Cultivating the Humanities and Social Sciences and Supporting Underrepresented Scholars of Asia" led by the Association for Asian Studies (AAS) and supported by SIDA - The Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency. It aims to support scholars located in economically disadvantaged regions of South and Southeast Asia, particularly junior faculty, graduate students, senior and independent scholars, women, and ethnic minority groups.

During the three-day workshop, we expect an active engagement of the participants to share their research and discuss how their works situate in the debates in various aspects culture-nature problems, environmental crisis, cultural complexity, and environmental justice, and etc.

The workshop targets academic staffs & graduate students in a higher-education institution in Southeast Asian or South Asian countries. 15 participants from Thailand, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Cambodia, Vietnam, and India are accepted and participate in the workshop.
